Articulated cranes under 16,000 lbs. capacity could only be operated by operators who are accredited. Operators should be knowledgeable regarding the features and operational characteristics of the machine. Before use, a pre-operational equipment check should be done. There is a legal prerequisite to perform a pre-operational check as well as an inspection of the work-site ground and overhead conditions.

The instructions provided in the manufacturer manual gives information about inspection, maintenance, and loading and unloading operations. According to legislation, daily and annual checks are mandatory. Operators are needed to maintain an up-to-date logbook within most regions. They may be required to confirm equipment warranties.

Adding remote control devices to the cranes is often recommended. Remote control improves safety by allowing the driver an easier alternative for handling the crane.

Improving crane safety would often help a company's bottom line. Such companies that follow safe equipment practices will usually see greater cost savings as opposed to companies that don't. The possibility of personal injury and equipment damage is greatly reduced if a well trained operator is handling the crane. Safety conscious drivers are a lot more productive resulting in reduced times required for unloading and loading.
